



Revisions to the Education in Good Clinical Practice Policy

As previously communicated, [Washington University's policy](#) requiring that all investigators and staff who are involved in the conduct, oversight or management of clinical trials be trained in Good Clinical Practice (GCP), and which satisfies the NIH requirement, became effective March 7, 2017.

Thank you to all who have completed GCP training in support of this requirement, as well as to those who have submitted feedback on the options WU has provided to satisfy the requirement.

After listening to feedback from the WU community, several changes to the educational requirements options will soon go into effect. These include:

- All GCP trainings at WU that satisfy the policy requirement are now available through a [single GCP Certification in Learn@Work](#)
- NIH-provided GCP training is now accepted to satisfy the policy requirement
- A new WUSTL-sponsored in-person GCP training option will be offered beginning in November, 2017
- As of October 16, 2017, the ACRP GCP courses and test-out challenge will no longer be offered through Learn@Work. Note that ACRP training completions prior to October 16, 2017 will continue to satisfy the requirement.

For those who have completed a CITI or ACRP GCP training through Learn@Work prior to October 16, 2017: you will be marked complete for the new GCP Certification. There is nothing further you need to do at this time.

For those who are in the process of completing an ACRP training in Learn@Work: you are able to complete the training to satisfy the new GCP Certification until October 16, 2017.

For those who have recently completed an NIH GCP training: email your certificate of completion to ovcrinfo@wustl.edu and you will be marked complete.

Note that specific sponsor, regulatory agencies, or school/department requirements may also be applicable. In these cases, it is the responsibility of the PI and research team members to complete any additional training requirements and maintain documentation.
