



Register for the 2018 NSF Graduate Research Fellowship Workshop

The National Science Foundation (NSF) Graduate Research Fellowship Writing Program (GRFP) Workshop is offered to senior undergraduate students, and first- or second-year graduate students in order to teach them proposal-writing skills, with the goal of applying to the [NSF GRFP](#). This workshop is for students in NSF-eligible fields, including fields related to science; technology; engineering; mathematics; physics; astronomy and astrophysics; STEM Education; anthropology and archeology; economics; sociology; data science; endangered languages; law and social science; political science; and cognitive sciences.

The program is supported by The Graduate School, The Division of Biology & Biomedical Sciences, The School of Engineering and Applied Sciences, and The Office of Postdoctoral Affairs. Lectures will be presented on both the Medical School and Danforth campuses.

The workshop consists of two seminars and three small group meetings.
