1) Mechanism: [The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society \(LLS\) Translational Research Program](#)

Program Details: The Translational Research Program (TRP) is for the treatment of blood cancer. TRP puts you on the bench-to-bedside fast track when it comes to finding better treatment and cures for leukemia, lymphoma and myeloma. LLS funds new and innovative research that shows high promise for translating basic biomedical knowledge to clinical application.

Eligibility: The proposed research should be clinically directed or clinically translatable in hematologic malignancies that is intended to develop innovative approaches to treatment, diagnosis, or prevention. Applicants must hold a PhD, MD, DVM or equivalent degree. LLS welcomes applications from both US citizens and non-citizens, as well as applicants who are performing research outside the US. Applicants must be appointed to a not-for-profit institution at the time the funding commences.

Amount: \$650,000 (\$216,666 per year for 3 years)

2) Mechanism: [The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society \(LLS\) Impactful Medicine Providing Access to Clinical Trials \(IMPACT\) Program](#) - NEW

Program Details: IMPACT is intended to recruit blood cancer patients served by community health settings, particularly rural, minority, and/or economically disadvantaged blood cancer patients, and to expand access to high-quality clinical trials.

Eligibility: Applicants must hold an MD or equivalent degree and must be affiliated with a non-profit Sponsoring Institution at the time funding commences and for the duration of the award. Applications may involve multiple institutions, but one institution must remain the Cancer Center Hub.

Amount: \$250,000 maximum for each year of the 5-year grant

3) Mechanism: [The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society \(LLS\) Career Development Program](#)

Deadline: 9/1/2019

a) [Scholar](#) (New independent faculty)

Amount: \$120,000 per year for 5 years

Requirements: The Scholar award supports rising stars in the blood cancer research field. You must be a highly qualified investigator who has shown a capacity for independent, sustained, original investigation in the field of

hematologic malignancies. You should hold an independent faculty-level position and should have obtained substantial support for your research from a national agency.

b) [Scholar in Clinical Research](#) (New independent clinical faculty)

Amount: \$125,000 per year for 5 years

Requirements: You must be a highly qualified investigator who holds an independent faculty-level appointment and is conducting original, independent applied research, often involving early-stage clinical trials that will advance the prevention, diagnosis or treatment of hematologic malignancies. The research should be related to your clinical activities, and must involve patients. You're expected to have concomitant support for your research from another source or agency.

Please note: Investigators who are primarily laboratory-based, and/or who are working on primarily blood cancer model systems rather than patients, are not eligible for the Scholar in Clinical Research Award, and should consider the Scholar Award.

c) [Special Fellow](#) (Post-docs)

Amount: \$67,000 per year for 2 or 3 years

Requirements: You must be a highly qualified postdoctoral fellow or instructor who's completed a minimum of 2.5 years of postdoctoral research training and is in a mentored research position, continuing a research program of direct relevance to hematological malignancies and/or relevant pre-malignant conditions. In addition, your Sponsor(s) must be have the appropriate experience to mentor you as you engage in blood cancer-relevant research. This award provides you with the opportunity to continue building a research program that will make you competitive for an independent position by the end of the award funding period.

d) [Fellow](#) (Post docs)

Amount: \$60,000 per year for 3 years

Requirements: You must be a promising investigator with less than 2.5 years of postdoctoral research training. This award encourages you to embark on an academic career involving basic or translational research in hematologic malignancies and/or relevant premalignant conditions under a research sponsor's direction. The proposal must be directly relevant to hematological malignancies and/or relevant pre-malignant conditions. In addition, your Sponsor(s) must be have the appropriate experience to mentor you as you engage in research of direct relevance to blood cancer.
