



Call for Applications: Doris Duke Fund to Retain Clinical Scientists Program

Letters of Intent and Applications Due: October 1st, 2019

The Doris Duke Fund to Retain Clinical Scientists (DDFRCS) Program assists junior and mid-career faculty facing extraprofessional demands. The DDFRCS provides broad-based education to raise awareness, and implement new interventions, resources and mentoring to support junior faculty facing extraprofessional challenges.

PROGRAM BENEFITS

- One-year grants of \$30,000 - \$50,000 (with the possibility of a second year) to fund a wide variety of assistance including technical or administrative support or up to 25% salary support for PI
- Two program mentors appointed for career development advice and sponsorship
- Annual meetings with current scholars, alumni and senior faculty to foster relationships and ongoing networking
- Programs focused on career development

APPLICANT ELIGIBILITY

- WashU Physician Scientists (MD, DO, or MD/PhD degree) at the Instructor or Assistant Professor level
- PI on a NIH, federal agency or foundation-sponsored grant
- Rationale for how funds will help maintain scientific productivity in the face of extraprofessional personal demands
