

Doris Duke Fund to Retain Clinical Scientists Program at Washington University School of Medicine

The Doris Duke Fund to Retain Clinical Scientists (DDFRCS) Program provides innovative institutional solutions to reduce faculty attrition by assisting junior faculty facing extraprofessional demands. The DDFRCS provides broad-based education to raise awareness, and implement new interventions, resources and mentoring to support junior faculty facing extraprofessional challenges.

PROGRAM BENEFITS:

- One-year grants of \$31,500 - \$56,500 (with the possibility of a second year) to fund a wide variety of assistance to 25% salary support for PI
- Two program mentors appointed for career development advice and sponsorship
- Annual meetings with current scholars, alumni and senior faculty to foster relationships and ongoing networking
- Programs focused on career development

APPLICANT ELIGIBILITY:

- WU Physician Scientists (MD, DO, or MD/PhD degree) at the Instructor or Assistant Professor level
- PI on a NIH, federal agency or foundation-sponsored grant
- Rationale for how funds will help maintain scientific productivity in the face of extraprofessional personal demands
